



A health information manager is responsible for planning, developing, information services. As a healthcare professional, HMIs manage clinical and administrative data in order to meet the medical. legal, ethical and administrative

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Health information managers (HIM) organize, oversee & protect patient health information data that has symptoms, diagnoses, medical histories, test results, and procedures. Some of the Health information managers daily duties:

- Work with various medical staff, including nurses and Idoctors, to improve the quality and accuracy of patient data.
- Code to ensure secure and bug-free systems for managing health information

- Collaborate with compliance officers that regularly track audits and denials from thirdparty auditors and insurance companies and find trends in the data.
